

The sessions with RRR were engaging. She worked hard, attentive, and focused on tasks. She also exhibits abilities to regulate her thoughts and independently cueing and correcting herself. She was observed to apply the learned skills in conversations.


RRR was working on producing sentences in subject-verb-complement structure, using two types of verbs: regular and irregular verbs. Those verbs are specified based on their word forms in the past tense. Past tense word form of a regular verb is *verb* + *ed* (*i.e.*, *discuss* becomes *discussed*), whereas, an irregular verb is a different word form (i.e., *eat* becomes *ate*, *sleep* becomes *slept*).

RRR also worked on sentences with subjectverb agreement in present tense simple sentences. She practiced those skills in retelling how to make S'mores Pops, No-Cook Sandwich Kabobs, and Oreo Spiders while having fun in making them.

In her storytelling, RRR included sequence conjunction vocabulary to signal the order of events. Her skills were extended to a short interview and a dialogue.

No-Cook Sandwich Kabob 5 Min(s) Prep


What You Need:

The recipe can be adapted to personal preferences for different events.


Lists of verbs targeted
